Did you know approximately 3.6 million Americans miss or delay medical care because they don't have transportation to their appointments? At Morris Hospital, we think everyone deserves reliable access to medical care. In 1998, we made sure of it by starting our own free Patient Transportation service.

25 years, 2.5 million miles, and more than 256,000 trips later, our Patient Transportation program still has an incredible impact on thousands in our community. But, none of this would be possible without generosity. EVERY SINGLE RIDE is made possible through donations. Some donate their time by driving a bus. Others make monetary donations to help cover the costs of the program. Our annual Auxiliary Golf Outing is another way to support those who need help getting to and from their medical appointments. This year's goal for the annual tournament is \$60,000 and we need your help. Gifts of ALL SIZES mean a lot to us.

HERE IS WHAT YOUR DONATION CAN DO:

\$5 takes a mom to her dialysis appointment because her kids are grown and live out-of-state.

\$10 provides a ride to and from chemo and radiation therapy for someone who is too weak to drive themselves.

\$15 provides three rides for an elderly patient who feels self-sufficient because he can coordinate his own rides and not burden family.

\$20 takes a widower to and from two doctors' appointments because her husband was always the driver.

\$25 replaces the windshield wipers on one Patient Transportation bus.

\$50 takes a heart attack survivor to and from his Cardiac Rehab appointments, once a week for 5 weeks.

\$75 covers one day of gas for a patient transportation bus.

\$100 takes a nervous and scared patient to meet our Breast Cancer Nurse Navigator after her recent diagnosis, once a week for 10 weeks.

\$150 replaces one tire on a bus after taking thousands of patients to and from their

\$250 provides 50 trips to doctor appointments for a grandmother with Alzheimer's who can no longer drive.
