## I. Purpose:

To outline the continuing education (CE) requirements for providers who are primary in the Morris Hospital Emergency Medical Services (EMS) System.

## II. Policy:

- **A.** <u>Paramedics</u>: A total of 100 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for Paramedics and during each four-year licensure period. It is recommended that 25 hours be completed within each year.
- **B.** Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)-Intermediates: A total of 80 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for EMT-Intermediates and during each four-year licensure period. It is recommended that 20 hours be completed within each year
- **C.** EMT-Basics: A total of 60 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for EMT-Basics and during each four-year licensure period. It is recommended that 15 hours be completed within each year
- **D.** Emergency Medical Responders (EMR): A total of 24 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for EMRs and during each four-year licensure period. It is recommended that 8 hours be completed within each year
- **E.** <u>Pre-Hospital Registered Nurses (PHRN)</u>: A total of 120 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for PHRNs and during each four-year licensure period. It is recommended that 30 hours be completed within each year
- **F.** Emergency Communications Registered Nurses (ECRN): A total of 32 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for ECRNS and during each four-year licensure period. It is recommended that 8 hours be completed within each year
- **G.** Emergency Medical Dispatchers (EMD): A total of 48 hours is mandated by the Department during each four-year licensure period for EMDs and during each four-year licensure period. It is required that 12 hours be completed within each year
- **III.** The following are offered to all levels of licensure:
  - A. Morris Hospital System CE 16 hours are offered per year (4 hours per live CE session); Morris Hospital System CE may also be completed online (1 hour per online CE session).
  - **B.** Morris Hospital EMS System providers must successfully complete the CE quiz with a minimum passing score of 80% during the respectable month/week it is due to obtain credit.
  - **C.** Additional training deemed mandatory by the System (e.g. policy, medication, SOP changes/updates); CE time will be awarded on an hour-for-hour basis.
  - **D.** Morris Hospital EMS System mandates at least 70% participation rate per quarter, between the agencies assigned days of CE.
